Via a far more equitable taxation system that focuses on the serious inequality in the distribution of wealth and the continuing growth in inequality in Australia and the adverse implications this has for low and increasingly middle income families.

Taxation suggestions we will bring to the forum will essentially be based on taxation of wealth. Given the paper you have circulated seems opposed to significant taxation increases then we will focus on many billions of dollars to be saved by the government in removing tax concessions to wealth which we regard as both unnecessary and unproductive.
